2. Association activities in 2019

2.1 Membership

Currently, CALC lists 68 members from the Czech Republic, Germany, UK, and USA. The number of members has been increasing steadily.

2.2 Events

In 2019, CALC held 2 major events:

2.2.1 Gesture-Sign Workshop Prague 2019: converging the perspectives on theories, methods, and applications, 16–17 May 2019.

The general idea behind the *Gesture-Sign Workshop Prague* is to bring together researchers who share the focus on multimodality but come from different areas. In particular, its goal is to provide an opportunity for a discussion between gesture researchers and sign linguists on one hand, and researchers who work with experimental (or generally quantitative) methods and those who approach the study of multimodality qualitatively on the hand.

Workshop programme consisted of oral presentations by three keynote speakers: Gerardo Ortega (Birmingham), Pamela Perniss (Cologne), Jürgen Streeck (Austin, TX) and six invited speakers: Benjamin Anible (Bergen), Linda Drijvers (Nijmegen), Tommi Jantunen (Jyväskylä), Petr Kaderka (Prague), Silva Ladewig (Frankfurt(Oder)), Peter Uhrig (Erlangen) and also two poster sessions.

The workshop was concluded by a group discussion chaired by J. P. de Ruitter (Boston) and Josef Fulka (Prague).

2.2.2 CALC:1 – The 1st Conference of the Czech Association for Language and Cognition, 21–22 November 2019.

CALC conference is a biannual convention of CALC members and non-member scholars and researchers sharing the interest in cognitively oriented approaches to

language and communication, with a particular (but not exclusive) focus on the indigenous languages of the Czech Republic.

The first CALC was intended as a small-scale event 2-day event. Its programme included keynote talks given by Laura Janda (Tromsø), Masako Fidler (Providence, RI), and Mirjam Fried (Prague) and two dozen contributions to regular sessions dedicated to grammatical analyses, psycholinguistic studies, discourse analyses and cultural approaches.

2.3 Development

In 2019, *Antropolingva* – a society for cultural linguistics, ethnolinguistics and anthropolinguistics – was incorporated to CALC as an Association's official branch. As for the end of 2019, *Antropolingva* lists 32 regular and 5 honorary members.

2.4 General assembly

The second CALC general assembly session was held on the 21st November 2019 at CALC-1 conference.

3. Constitution amendments

No amendments to the Constitution were adopted in 2019.

4. Prospects for 2020

Scheduled for the second half of 2020, the second installment of the *Gesture-Sign Workshop Prague* will build upon the success of the 2019's event with a more specialized thematic scope. Call for papers to be launched in January 2020.

In the year 2020, dates, venue and thematic profiling of CALC-2 convention will be determined. The CALC board advocates the ideas of decentralization and diversity: future conferences should be held at different venues across the Czech Republic.
